- We have also been kept safe in our home and have to date not had any reason to feel otherwise.

- Teacher development afternoons have continued to be successful with a relaxed and friendly atmosphere amongst the teachers.
- My bible study is now on 'summer' break, those girls are amazing - it is still the highlight of my week - except it won't be on again until closer to July. Some of us, left in Rwanda without travel plans, plan to meet up at the same time over different weeks.
- I have been incredibly blessed with many visitors all of whom have been wonderful to have and show around Rwanda - praise God for safe travels from all angles of this globe. Also for Fred who has traveled recently too.
